Are You Aware

Dogging require a High Risk Licence. Large penalties apply to employers and employees who perform Dogging without the appropriate licence.

(DG) Dogging Training and Assessment (5 days) High Risk Licence

Course Objective

To provide the participant with the skills and knowledge to undertake Dogging activities in accordance with Safe Work Australia's National Standard for Licensing Persons Performing High Risk Work (April 2006).

Course Outcome

On successful completion of this course students will be issued with a statement of attainment for the unit:

- CPCCLDG3001A Licence to Perform Dogging

Course Content

- Plan job
- Select and inspect equipment
- Prepare site and equipment
- Perform task
- Shut down job and clean up

Course Prerequisites

- Students must be 18 years of age to undertake assessment.
- Ability to use and understand basic English.
- Must be able to work at heights
- A basic understanding of mathematics is required which includes multiplication, subtraction and division.
- Additionally must be able to use a calculator
- Having a log book of evidence of hours signed off by a ticketed person /or letter from employer will assist participants in the successful completion of the program

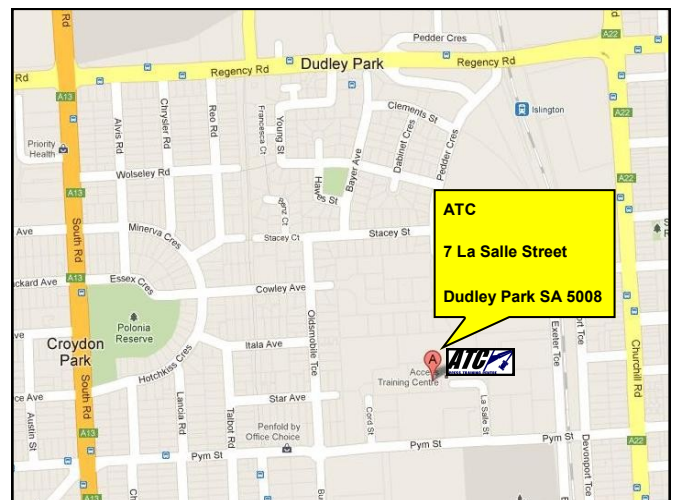
Facilities Required:

- Whiteboard with marker pens
- Chairs and tables
- Power
- Projector and screen (if available)

Equipment and Infrastructure to include (but not limited to):

- Whistles and Fixed Frequency Radios
- Flexible Steel Wire Rope Slings
- Synthetic Slings
- Chain Slings
- Shackles
- Crane sling shorteners
- Lifting ring

Similar equipment will need to be supplied in an "unserviceable condition" for the purposes of identification.



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
