Are You Aware

This licence course covers the requirements for transporting bulk dangerous goods. This licence applies to transporting dangerous goods in a container or vessel that could hold 500 litres (or 500kg) or more.

This licence is not required for transporting packaged dangerous good (small containers).

This course does not cover driver training or information relating to warehousing of dangerous goods.

TLILIC0001 Licence to transport dangerous goods by road

Course Objective

To provide Students with a comprehensive understanding of the hazards associated with the handling and transport of dangerous goods by road. This course provides Students with the skills and knowledge to interpret HAZCHEM codes, Australian Goods Code (ADG Code) and all of the state related requirements to obtain a dangerous goods (DG) driver licence to transport Dangerous Goods.

Course Outcome

On successful completion of this course Students will be issued

- Statement of Attainment
- Statement of Assessment
- Dangerous Goods Licence issued by the Department of Local Government, Industry Regulation and Safety (LGIRS)



Course Content

- Identify individual organisations and systems for the transport of dangerous goods
- Identify UN numbers, classes and divisions of dangerous goods including packaging groups and categories of dangerous goods
- Maintain dangerous goods documentation
- Plan and manage safe transport of dangerous goods
- Check all safety equipment and its serviceability
- Check vehicle and assess suitability of transport mode for intended load
- Follow emergency procedures
- Plan, control and manage transfer of dangerous goods

Student Requirements

- Students must be 17 years of age to undertake assessment.
- Students will be required to complete a mandatory Language, Literacy, Numeracy (LLN) Quiz prior to attending the training course.
- Literacy Requirements
 - * English Language – at a level to understand Industry terminology
 - * Reading – ability to read and interpret basic documents
 - * Writing – basic skills or ability in completing written work
 - * Numeracy - understanding weight measurements, metric conversions and basic mathematical calculations

To apply for the Dangerous Goods Drivers Licence, students must:

- Reside in Western Australia
- Hold a current Western Australian Drivers Licence (*Provisional "P" plate drivers are not eligible*)
- Apply for the Dangerous Goods licence within 6 months of completion of course
- Provide the Statement of Attainment as evidence of completion of this course
- Provide a National Police Clearance (NPC) and evidence of driving record for past 5 years
- Provide the required completed Medical Certificate (*refer to LGIRS website*)
- Provide colour copy of both sides of drivers licence

The Dangerous Goods Licence is valid for 5 years. Licence holders are required to complete the full course again to renew their licence.
