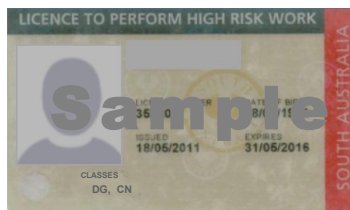

Are You Aware

Crane operation requires a High Risk Licence. Large penalties apply to employers and employees who perform crane operation without the appropriate licence.

Course Objective

To provide the Student with the skills and knowledge to operate a Non Slewing Mobile Crane (CN) in accordance with Safe Work Australia's National Standard for Licensing Persons Performing High Risk Work.

Course Outline

Day 1 - 2: Training and Assessment to TLILIC0040 Licence to Operate a Non-Slewing Mobile Crane (greater than 3 tonnes capacity) (VET Unit)

Day 3 - 4: SafeWork SA High Risk Work Licence (HRWL) Assessment

Note: Competency must be achieved to the VET Unit prior to commencing the HRWL Assessment. If Competency to the VET Unit is not achieved, the course will need to be extended and additional fees will apply.

It is **strongly recommended** that Students read the Training Manual and complete the Practice Questions prior to attending.

Student Suitability

This course is recommended for Students with a current Dogging HRWL licence that are required to operate a Non Slewing Mobile Crane (greater than 3 tonnes capacity). Dogging experience slinging loads and directing cranes is highly recommended for this course.

 - * Numeracy - understanding weight measurements, metric conversions and basic mathematical calculations. Students must be able to use a calculator.
