

Evidence of Dogging High Risk Work Licence required for Crane Courses

On 13th September 2018 changes were made to the National Units of Competence relating to High Risk Work Licences from the Transport and Logistics Training Package.

Each new Unit states: A person undertaking training in this unit must hold:

A current National High-Risk Work Licence (HRWL) to perform dogging or a certification for a specific VET course for HRWL to perform dogging

ATC Implementation dates for crane Courses are below:

Course	New Unit	Implementation Date
(CN) Licence to operate a non-slewing mobile crane (greater than 3 tonnes capacity)	TLILIC0008	1 st April 2019
(C2) Licence to operate a slewing mobile crane (up to 20 tonnes)	TLILIC0010	1 st April 2019
(C6) Licence to operate a slewing mobile crane (up to 60 tonnes)	TLILIC0013	1 st April 2019
(C1) Licence to operate a slewing mobile crane (up to 100 tonnes)	TLILIC0014	1 st April 2019
(CO) Licence to operate a slewing mobile crane (over 100 tonnes)	TLILIC0015	1 st April 2019
(CV) Licence to operate a vehicle loading crane (capacity 10 metre tonnes and above)	TLILIC0002	1 st July 2019
(CB) Licence to operate a bridge and gantry crane	TLILIC0006	1 st July 2019
